






WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

After earning their degree, 75% of students are employed and almost half received job offers before graduation. Eighteen percent choose to further their education by enrolling in graduate or professional programs. The rest typically spend their time traveling or volunteering for organizations like the Peace Corps or City Year. Of those who work right after graduation, 75% plan to pursue an advanced degree in the future.




Planning a visit to the University of San Diego is easy. Just visit our Web site, www.sandiego.edu/ campustours to schedule a tour of our campus.

Admission to the University of San Diego is highly competitive, and we are looking for students who not only have a strong record of academic success, but also possess the personal qualities and commitment to service necessary to thrive in a dynamic and progressive campus community.





For freshman admission, students may apply either through our Early Action program (November 15 deadline), or our Regular Decision program (January 15 deadline). Interested applicants may apply through either the Common Application (www.commonapp.org), or the university's own online application at www. sandiego.edu/application.

Decisions on Early Action applications will be made by the end of January. Decisions for applicants under the Regular Decision program will be made by April 1.

Applications from transfer applicants are also welcome during the fall or spring semester. The deadline to apply for the fall semester is March 1. Applicants wishing to transfer into the spring semester should apply by October 1.

Financial Aid

Our tuition is competitive with other private, selective universities.


Freshmen are required to live on campus and housing is available all four years. Tuition and room and board charges can be found at www.sandiego.edu/ admissions/undergraduate.

Over 70% of students receive financial aid and both need and merit-based forms of aid are available. Families should complete the FAFSA to be considered for need-based aid.

Merit Scholarships are automatically awarded in the admissions process. They are reserved for students in the top portion of our applicant pool.

Athletic, choral and music scholarships are also available.

USD has a ROTC program for students who are selected to participate.

- Average Weighted GPA: 3.9
- Average SAT Reasoning Score, not including Writing: 1240
- Average ACT Composite Score: 28
