




INDEPENDENT FILM PRODUCTION



The class is a weeklong practical workshop that will survey the five phases of creating and marketing independent films: development, pre-production, physical production, post-production, and distribution. With a blend of lectures, case studies, and guidance in creating a pitch deck for a prospective project, students will learn tangible skills to get started with putting together a feature-length narrative or documentary film.

Jared Ruga is an executive producer with a preference for screenwriting who produces narrative and documentary projects. He is driven by the guiding ethos of Vavani (the production company he founded) to tell timely, compelling, authentic, and socially conscious stories from underrepresented perspectives. Ruga is a 2011 Honors Program triple major undergraduate alumnus of the University of San Diego.
