

Go international! Since graduating in 2017, so much has changed. Three days after commencement I flew to Europe to pursue a job as a Kayak/SUP Instructor at an international children's summer camp in the small coastal town of Pakoštane, Croatia. I stayed there for three months and met some of the most incredible people, saw the most amazing sights, and ate the tastiest food. My time came to an end and I flew to Italy to work as an English teacher. I was based in Matera, a small city with loads of history as it's home to paleolithic caves that surround the old town portion. Working with kids from all over the world really is incredible because it's so interesting to see what the education system is like in each country and the unique qualities of the kids around the world.

March 2018 I was on a plane flying directly to Auckland with a backpack, suitcase, and my Working Holiday Visa, hoping to find a job in my field. Since then, things have fallen into place quite nicely. After two weeks, I found a flat just outside the city and a job in a small beach town called St. Heliers.

I'm now an Account Executive at a PR and Marketing company whose focus is mostly on combining inbound marketing with public relations and storytelling. My main responsibilities include interviewing subjects for stories, writing and editing press releases, publishing blogs, managing orders for events, and handling client outreach projects. This job has also helped me to touch up my writing and I have been doing freelance writing for different travel publications which is a dream come true.

While my visa only lasts a year, I'm so grateful for any time I get to spend in this country. I have so much to thank USD for, including the amazing staff at the study abroad office and my incredible professors Gina Lew, Leeva Chung, Antonieta Mercado, Greg Ghio, and Roger Pace in the Comm Department who helped me perfect my writing skills and prepare me for entering this field.
