Dr. Stern has been appointed the new Director of USD's Honors Program. Her office is in Maher 264. She will continue to teach and advise Comm students. Stop by her office!



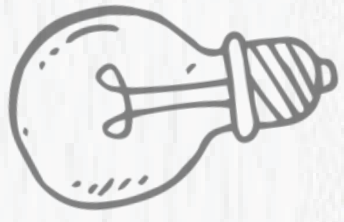

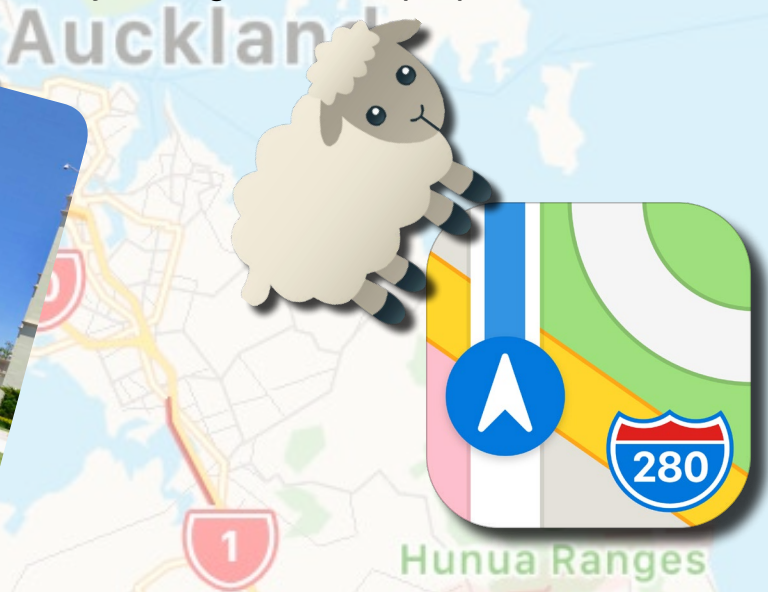
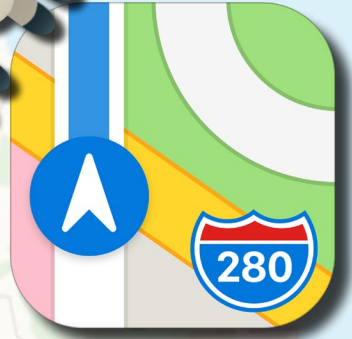
I went home on Halloween to Malibu, CA and spent much needed time with my friends and family. But, I started planning my next adventure: New Zealand!
