
- The USTR is responsible for developing and coordinating U.S. international trade and investment policy, and overseeing negotiations with other countries.



 - Justice



- Currently the EU has trade agreements in place with 70 countries



Official Journal

The bulk of EU law documents are published in the Official Journal of the European Union (referred to as OJ), which is also available through <u>EUR-Lex</u>

- "C" series (Communications) draft legislation, notices, reports



UK & Brexit

- UK-EU trade
 - The UK will need an agreement with the EU to stop new tariffs and other trade barriers coming into force after <u>after the transition</u> <u>period ends on 31 December 2020.</u>

TPP and TPP-11

- The Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP), never entered into force.
 - the United States signed on Feb. 4, 2016 and withdrew on Jan. 23, 2017)
- The Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP-11), entered into force Dec. 30, 2018
 - Available at the <u>New Zealand Ministry of Foreign Affairs</u> and <u>Trade</u> – New Zealand is the official depository
