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Master of Arts in Leadership Studies

Program Overview

The Master of Arts degree in Leadership Studies is a 36-unit program designed for students preparing for leadership positions in a broad variety of organizational settings, including, but not limited to: consulting firms; human resource departments; nonprofit agencies; colleges and universities; and public and private K-12 schools.

The focus of the master's degree is on developing knowledgeable, ethical, caring and inclusive leaders for a diverse and changing society. We prepare "practitionerscholars" to make significant contributions in a variety of organizational settings. We aspire to enhance students' capacity to lead in ways that are creative, caring and inspirational.

Students develop their understanding of leadership by studying leadership theories, research, ethics, and organizational change, and by examining best practices. The program offers candidates the opportunity to study leadership theory and practice and apply leadership concepts and principles to their personal and professional roles and responsibilities.

This degree offers flexibility for students to develop a unique area of specialization. In consultation with their advisors, students will design an 18-unit course sequence to meet their individual professional goals and educational interests. Students may choose from courses in any graduate program in the School of Leadership and Education Sciences (SOLES) or other graduate level courses from the other colleges and schools within the University of San Diego.

Area of Specialization/Electives (18 units)

Exit Requirement

The exit requirement may consist of a portfolio, action research project/thesis or traditional thesis, depending on area of focus.

International Experience

Admission Requirements

While applicants are evaluated based on a holistic method, the successful candidate for the program will demonstrate his or her candidacy in the following

- Completed online USD application, available at www.sandiego.edu/ admissions/graduate/application.php
- · College or university transcripts. Applicants must submit one official sealed transcript from every college or university attended.
- Three professional letters of recommendation from supervisors, employers or professors.
- Statement of purpose
- Resume
- A minimum grade point average of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in all undergraduate
- The Graduate Record Examination (GRE) is not required, however applicants at or near the minimum GPA may choose to submit GRE General Test scores to strengthen their application.

Application Deadline: March 1st

The Master of Arts in Leadership Studies only accepts students for the fall term. Students admitted for the fall semester may begin coursework the preceding summer.

Additional Requirements for International Students

- Transcripts must be issued in English by the academic institution or must be officially translated by an approved agency. Applicants are required to have their foreign transcripts evaluated by an independent credential evaluation service. Applicants may contact The International Education Research Foundation, Inc. and request a Detail Report, or World Education Services and request a Course-by-Course Report.
- Submit the official results of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). Minimum requirements are 83 (internetbased), 237 (computer-based), or 580 (paper-
