








Why now?



- New OMB Uniform Guidance mandates 10% or more indirect cost rate in nonprofit-government contracts that include federal money
- Grantmaker interest: Northern California, San Diego and Southern California Grantmakers, Forefront (Illinois), GEO, others
- Rising influence of the online charity raters which rely heavily on overhead rates as a proxy for excellence








Moving the needle(s)?









When compared to other states, California:


- Ranks as the 4th worst in the country re failing to pay full costs.
- 7 in 10 California nonprofits report that government funding doesn't cover full costs
- 65% are reimbursed at rates of 10% or less




Nonprofit fills gap through gap-filling strategies




Deferred maintenance


