GET INFORMED: Find out about the history, mission and core values that make USD a unique place.


MEET YOUR FAN CLUB: Meet the student leaders and staff here to support you as a new transfer student this semester and beyond.

HARRY POTTER ROOM MOTHER

ROSALIE HILL READING ROOM – Located on the main floor of Copley Library, this is a silent study room open to students and the campus community during library hours.

JCP JENNY CRAIG PAVILION – Home to several USD athletic teams, including men's and women's basketball and volleyball. It is also used for large special events, new student convocation and commencement.

MISH CAP MISSIONS CAPE – Located in the valley by the Mission Crossroads office, this is a great place to grab a meal or snack.

P-SAFE PUBLIC SAFETY – The Department of Public Safety is located on the south side of the Hughes Administration Center and is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to help with emergency situations.

RA RESIDENT ASSISTANT – An upper-class student who lives in your residence hall and facilitates your transition to USD and serves as a resource for your first year.

SLIC STUDENT LEADERSHIP AND INVOLVEMENT CENTER – This office oversees all student clubs and organizations and is located in the Student Life Pavilion, room 316.

SLP STUDENT LIFE PAVILION – A focal point of student life and dining on campus. Pavilion Dining, La Gran Terraza restaurant, O'Tooles' Lounge, Tu Mercado and several student organization offices can be found here. TPB TORERO PROGRAM BOARD -

An organization charged with coordinating student programs and events held on campus.

TRANSFER TEAM TRANSFER TRANSITION TEAM – A group of continuing transfer students who support you as you transition to USD.

TSO TRANSFER STUDENT ORGANIZATION – A club that hosts a variety of events to get transfers connected with each other and USD.

TU MERC TU MERCADO – A full-service grocery store, deli and coffee bar located on the second floor of the Student Life Pavilion.

UC HAHN UNIVERSITY CENTER – This building houses various department offices, conference rooms and lounge areas.

UTAS UNIVERSITY TERRACE APARTMENTS - Located across Linda Vista Road from the south side of campus, many transfer students live in this University housing and enjoy awesome views of the bay.

THE VALLEY MISSIONS A AND B, SAN BUENAVENTURA, SAPS, VALLEY FIELD, MISSION CROSSROADS, MISSIONS CAFÉ AND FITNESS CENTER – Collectively, these residence buildings, amenities and offices located on the east side of campus between the Student Life Pavilion and the Jenny Craig Pavilion are known as The Valley.
