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The reimagined Women PeaceMakers Program builds upon its previous 14 years by offering a unique 12-month fellowship that focuses on how to transform peacebuilding through building more effective collaborations between women peacebuilders from conflict-affected communities and international peace partners. The fellowship includes a 6-week residency at USD and ongoing learning community with a cohort of international partners.

The Women Waging Peace Network at the Kroc IPJ is a network of more than 1,000 women peacemakers from around the world. The IPJ provides opportunities to foster learning and connect members meaningfully within the Network, and integrate their leadership models and strategies into Kroc IPJ's learning and practice.

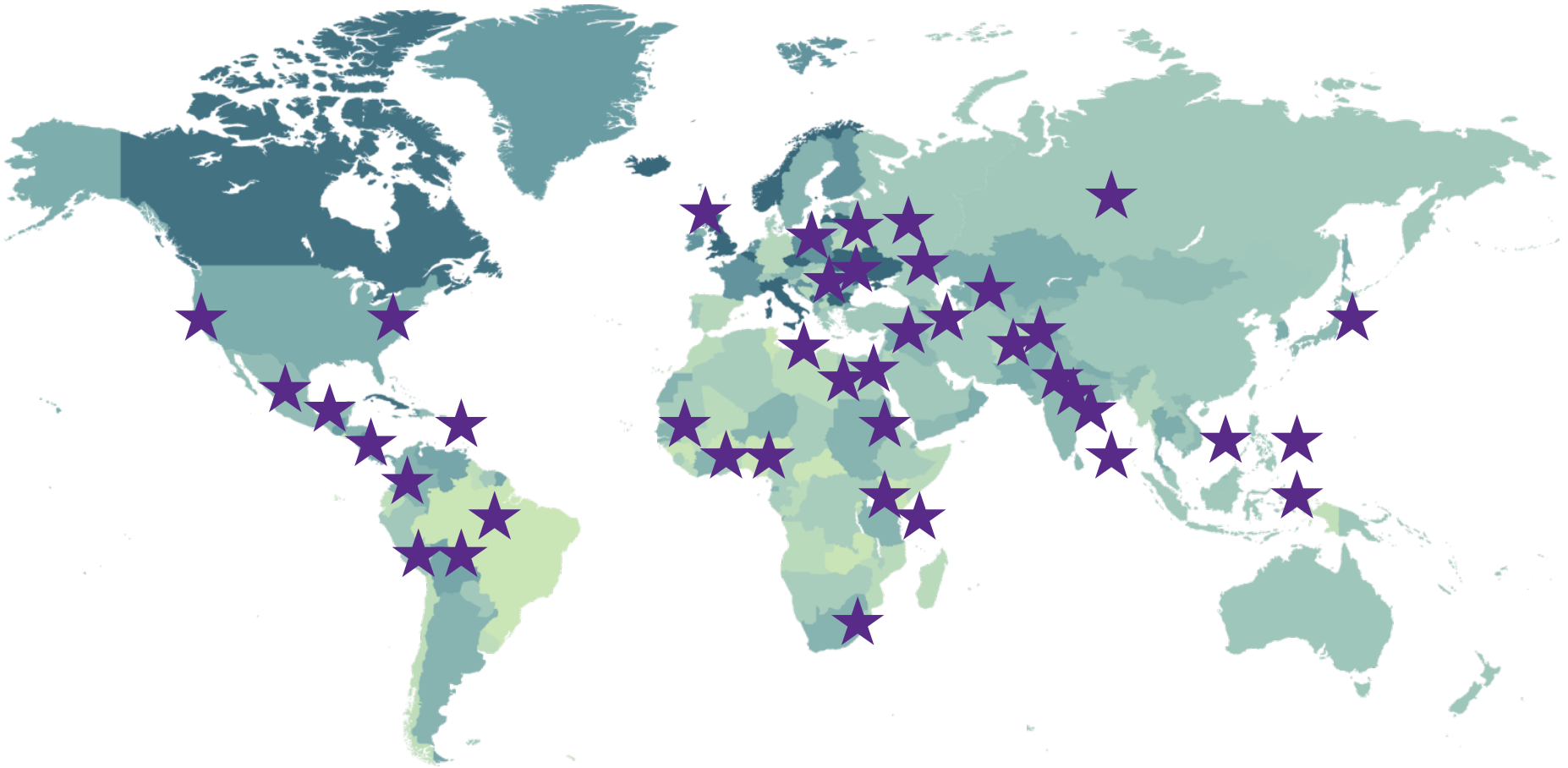


Kroc School Masters students will have the opportunity to wage peace and engage with women peacemakers, both locally and globally, through the following...

<i>Women Peace and Security (WPS) Intern (Paid Position)</i>	Partner with and support our two WPS programs: Women PeaceMaker and Women Waging Peace Network. These two programs bring together over 1000 women from 56 different countries, who are ending cycles of violence. The internship will work to drive forward a number of exciting initiatives within our work.	<i>1</i>

<i>Women Waging Peace (WWP) International Convening Experiential</i>	Travel internationally to be a part of an intimate gathering of leading international peace building experts and our WWP members. This event is usually 3-days long and held internationally. We convene to discuss, explore and document critical insights and learnings into peace building.	<i>1</i>
<i>United Nations Commission on the Status for Women Student Delegate</i>	Be a student delegate at this internationally prestigious United Nations gathering of over 8,000 peacebuilders come from around the world to discuss the pressing issues for women, peace and security.	<i>Up to 4</i>

<i>Women Waging Peace Internship – or- Capstone Project</i>	Conduct your summer internship or Capstone project with one of the 1,000 WWP members, who work in 55 different countries, cover over 35 thematic peace building experts and operate in organizations ranging from the UN to grassroots civil society organizations.	<i>Open</i>

<i>Building Trust Partnership Intern (Paid Position)</i>	Work in San Diego as part of the Building Trust Partnership to support the work of the project. Attend cohort member events, help to design outreach and communication strategies, monitor the ongoing work of the project, and build a network of community leaders, officials, and activists working to make San Diego's neighborhoods safer.	1-2
Volunteers (unpaid)		
<i>Police-Community Relations Blogger</i>	Stay up-to-date on current events, pending legislation, community efforts, etc. that affect police-community relations in San Diego County. Attend public events to learn more about how religious and community leaders and law enforcement are creating connections and building trust. Then, work with Kroc IPJ Staff to write posts for the Kroc School's blog reporting on these happenings and analyzing their impact.	Open
<i>Building Trust Event Volunteer – Note-take, facilitator, and more</i>	The Building Trust Partnership holds meetings and events throughout the year, many of which require additional assistance, from taking notes to facilitating conversations and more.	Open
<i>Community Partner Volunteer</i>	The Building Trust Partnership works with numerous community partners. Periodically they need help on specific projects. As a community partner volunteer you'll have a chance to work with and get to know important individuals and organizations active in San Diego's communities.	Open

<i>Social Fabric Initiative (SFI) Internship (Paid Position)</i>	During the Fall and Spring, assist the Program Officer with planning, marketing, fundraising, and conducting outreach for the Social Fabric Initiative. Past interns have helped with developing ideas for workshops and improvements to the program, making connections to mentors, research, etc.	<i>Up to 2</i>
<i>SFI Summer Intern – Thread Liaison (Paid Position)</i>	SFI is built on the summer programming that occurs with high school volunteers, community mentors, and university-level interns working together on social change projects as part of a Thread. Additional responsibilities will include, and are not limited to: communication and coordination, social media and blog development, website management, and event planning.	10
