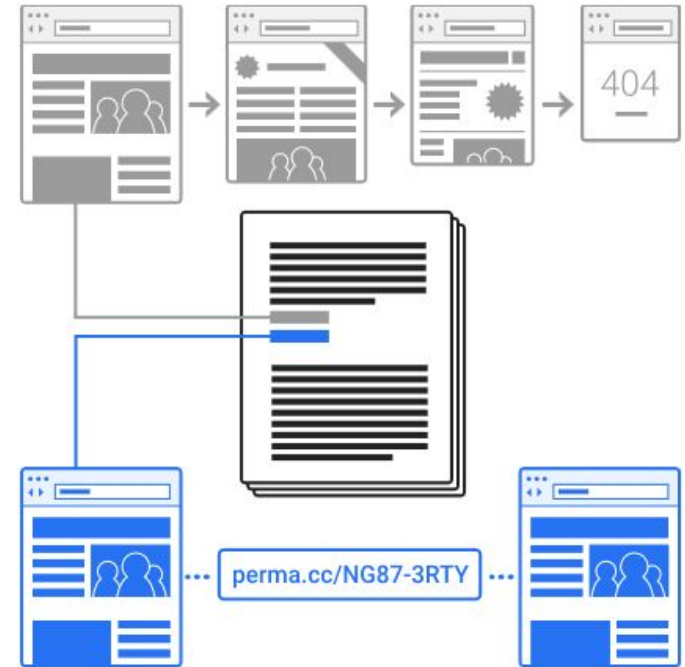

Overview

What is Perma.cc?

Perma.cc is a service that helps prevent link rot. Use it to preserve the online sources you cite and to make those records accessible to your readers.

What is link rot?

Link rot (and "reference rot") happens when you cite to an online source that later disappears or changes. It's a big problem, especially for academic scholarship and judicial opinions, which depend heavily on citations to stable sources that readers can access. For example, a **study** conducted by researchers at Harvard Law School found that more than 70% of the links in a sample of law journals and 50% of the links in Supreme Court opinions no longer work.

If you're part of a court, please contact us directly using **this form** and we'll help you get started.

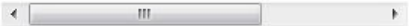

The Fourth Amendment at the border and beyond: A few thoughts on *Hernandez v. Mesa*

The Supreme Court will hear arguments next week in a Fourth Amendment case, *Hernandez v. Mesa*. The facts of the case are simple. At the border that separates El Paso, Tex., from Ciudad Juárez, Mexico, a U.S. border patrol agent named Mesa shot and killed a Mexican citizen named Hernandez. The bullet itself crossed the border, as Mesa was on U.S. land and Hernandez was on Mexican land. A subsequent lawsuit was filed by Hernandez's parents, as successors-in-interest to his estate, alleging excessive force under the Fourth Amendment.

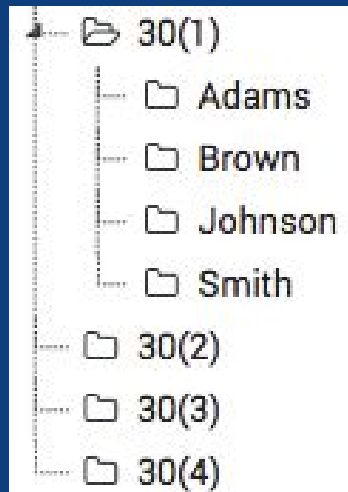

(d) Archival. Archiving of Internet sources is encouraged, but only when a reliable archival tool is available. For citations to Internet sources, append the archive URL to the full citation in brackets:

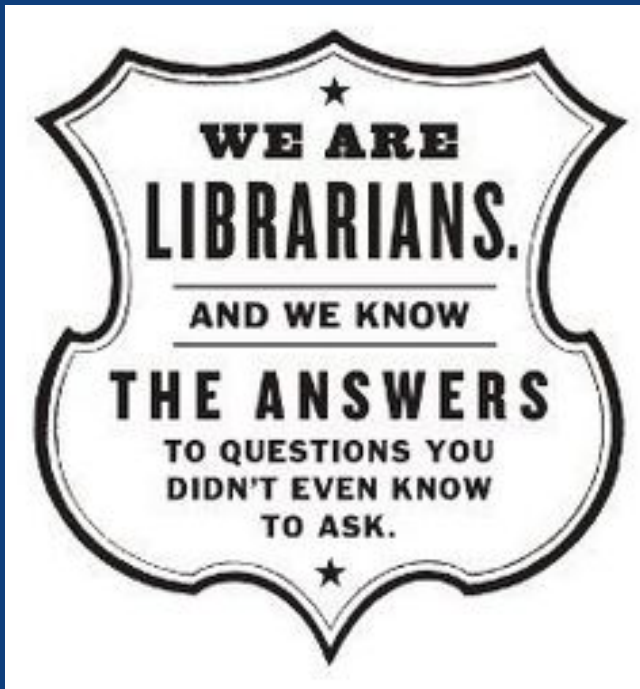
