ENGL 230: *Native American Autobiography*

The course seeks to understand how Native Americans utilize autobiography to reflect not only various types of engagements and relationships Native peoples have with the United States, but the ways in which these memoirs reflect community structures, relationships with and manifestations of tribal cultures and sovereignty, religious, political, and historical contexts, and one's place in the worlds that are markedly distinct from an individualism that grounds much of "American" culture. Further, the course will study how contemporary autobiographies, from nineteenth-century 'told to' narratives to first-person contemporary narratives, challenge the rules of conventional autobiography in favor of expansive indigenous ways of life-writing. Offering critical essays that help students to theorize about the genre, the course will challenge stereotypical assumptions about American Indian identity and will study American Indian inventiveness in the wake of colonial contact. Authors we will read: Black Elk, Joy Harjo, Deborah Miranda, Linda Hogan, and N. Scott Momaday.
