



Reliable sources

- Evaluate sources for:
 - Authority author is identified, reputable, credentialed
 - Objectivity fairness and lack of bias
 - Accuracy provides references to sources, verifiable
 - Scope relevant to your topic and argument
 - Currency may vary by topic, but make sure you know the current state of thinking in your field (even if it's rooted in older writings)





Al Litigation Database

This database presents information about ongoing and completed litigation involving artificial intelligence, including machine learning. It covers cases from complaint forward – as soon as we learn of them – whether or not they generate published decisions. It is intended to be broad in scope, covering everything from algorithms used in hiring and credit and criminal sentencing decisions to liability for accidents involving autonomous vehicles. It also includes some cases concerning statistical analysis and data protection that may not directly involve artificial intelligence, but that are of particular relevance to AI projects. It includes cases addressing whether AIs can be authors of works protected by copyright law, or inventors of inventions protected by patent law, but it does not include litigation concerning patents that may involve artificial intelligence or machine learning.

Because some search engines have a difficult time indexing pages that incorporate dynamic content served from another server, the table displayed below is static, and represents the database contents as of October 10, 2022. 
GW Law has received grants from New America's Public Interest Technology program to advance the public good in digital technology.

Ethical Tech@GW is an interdisciplinary collaboration where law meets computer science and engineering, media and public affairs, and social entrepreneurship. This initiative aims to examine the values that digital technologies implicitly embody and reflect, and the values that they should be built or redesigned to support. Through the initiative, we bring in guest technologists and other experts to interact with faculty and students, lecture and participate in expert roundtables on issues such as access to justice for marginalized communities, reproductive data privacy post-Dobbs, social media manipulation through mis/disinformation, and the values implicit in algorithmic decision making. We have launched a research project with colleagues from the School of Engineering and Applied Sciences and the School of Media and Public Affairs on the efficacy of a variety of methods for combatting mis/disinformation. Student researchers from GW Law and other graduate-level programs are deeply engaged in this interdisciplinary work by organizing expert roundtables, studying and analyzing fact checking and labeling of mis/disinformation communications on social media, and studying algorithmic fairness and bias issues.






Search strategies

- Ask a librarian!






THE LEGAL INFRASTRUCTURE OF HIGH TECHNOLOGY INDUSTRIAL DISTRICTS: SILICON VALLEY, ROUTE 128, AND COVENANTS NOT TO COMPETE

In recent years, scholars and policymakers have rediscovered the concept of industrial districts--spatial concentrations of firms in the same industry or related industries. In this Article, Professor Gilson examines the relationship between high-technology industrial districts and legal infrastructure by comparing the legal regimes of California's Silicon Valley and Massachusetts's Route 128. He contends that legal rules governing evmployee mobility influence the dynamics of high technology industrial districts by either encouraging rapid employee movement between employers and to startups, as in Silicon Valley, or discouraging such movement, as in Route 128. Because California does not enforce post-employment covenants not to compete, high technology firms in Silicon Valley gain from knowledge spillovers between firms. These knowledge spillovers have allowed Silicon Valley firms to thrive while Route 128 firms have deteriorated. Professor



In Supreme Court Opinions, Web Links to Nowhere

WASHINGTON — Supreme Court opinions have come down with a bad case of link rot. According to <u>a new study</u>, 49 percent of the hyperlinks in Supreme Court decisions no longer work.

This can sometimes be amusing. A link in <u>a 2011 Supreme Court opinion</u> about violent video games by Justice Samuel A. Alito Jr. now leads to a mischievous error message.

"Aren't you glad you didn't cite to this Web page?" it asks. "If you had, like Justice Alito did, the original content would have long since disappeared and someone else might have come along and purchased the domain in order to make a comment about the transience of linked information in the Internet age."



Why good note-taking is important

- Cite to the best sources to develop and bolster your argument
- The first step in avoiding plagiarism and giving proper documentation is to cultivate good note-taking habits.
- If you cut & paste text from another source to look at later, **immediately** mark it as copied text & include citation info




