Foreign Websites

- Use <u>Google translate</u> and the Google translate widget in Google Chrome
- Directly translate foreign websites instead of using the English 'portal' (usually a pared down version of the full website)
- Generate keywords to search websites or Google in the original language.

Lexis

- Secondary Materials > Law Reviews & Journals
- For material from specific countries click on the International Tab. Click on View All Countries to see the full list of available countries.

Westlaw

- Secondary Sources > Law Reviews & Journals
- Westlaw has a few treatises helpful for international trade and trade agreements:
 - NAFTA Handbook
 - NAFTA: Legal Text & Interpretive Materials
- To navigate by specific country, click on International Materials, then select one of the main six foreign jurisdictions (Australia, Canada, European Union, Hong Kong, Korea, United Kingdom), or select Other International Jurisdictions.
