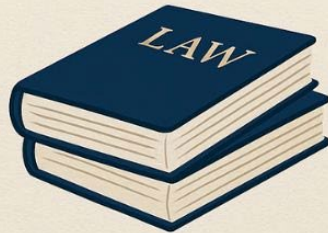

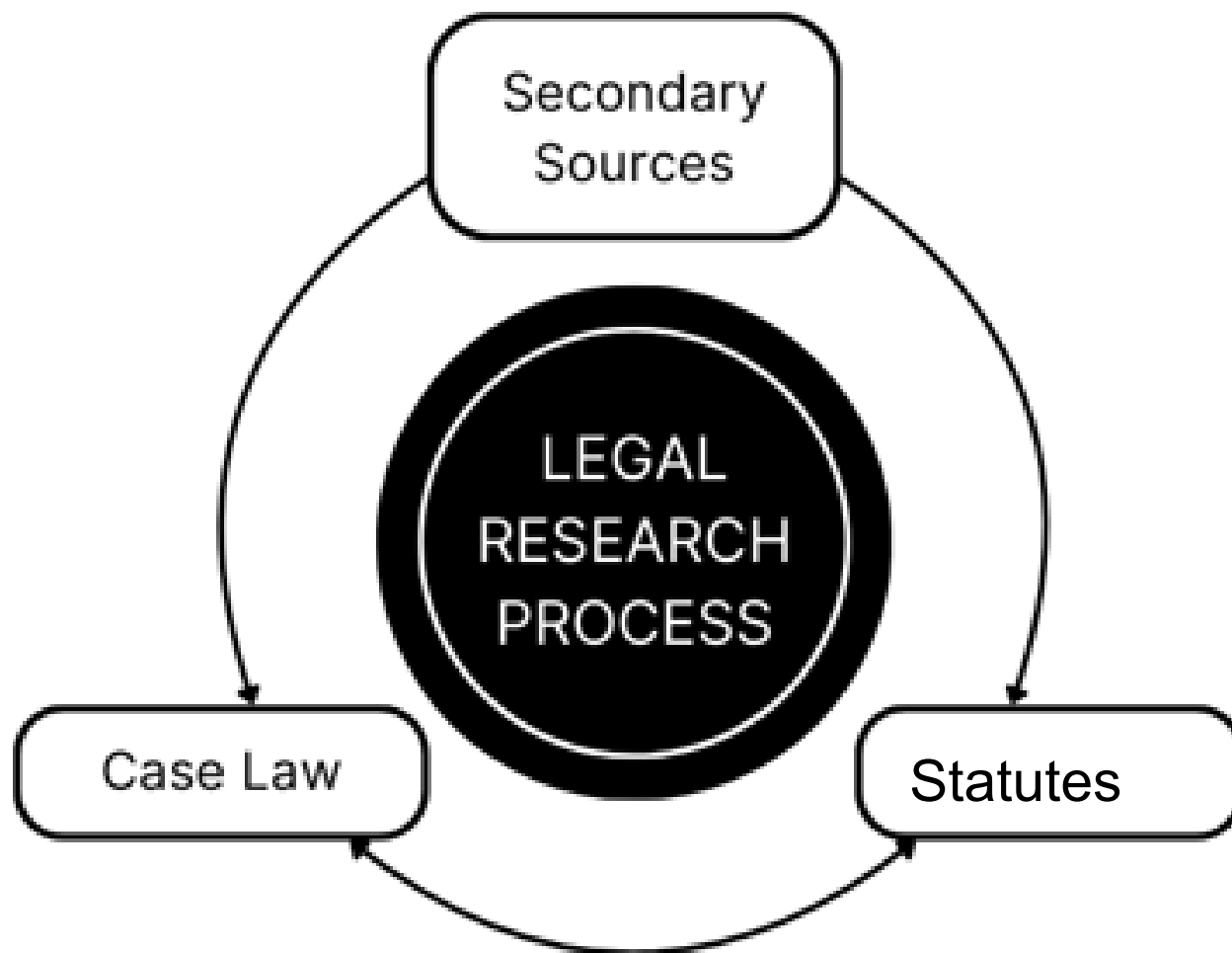

2. Locating Specific Types of Secondary Sources

Three different ways:

- Do a keyword search, then use filters to filter to the appropriate source type.
- Type the specific name of a title if you know it (e.g. California Jurisprudence).
- Browse by category without entering a keyword search (e.g. Secondary sources → California)

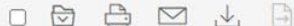

Charter school funding. The Charter School Law provides for the funding of charter schools by requiring that an amount based upon a statutory formula per student be paid to the charter school by the school district of residence of each such student. If a school district fails to make such payment, the Secretary of Education must deduct such amount from state payments to the district.

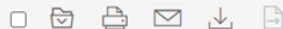
